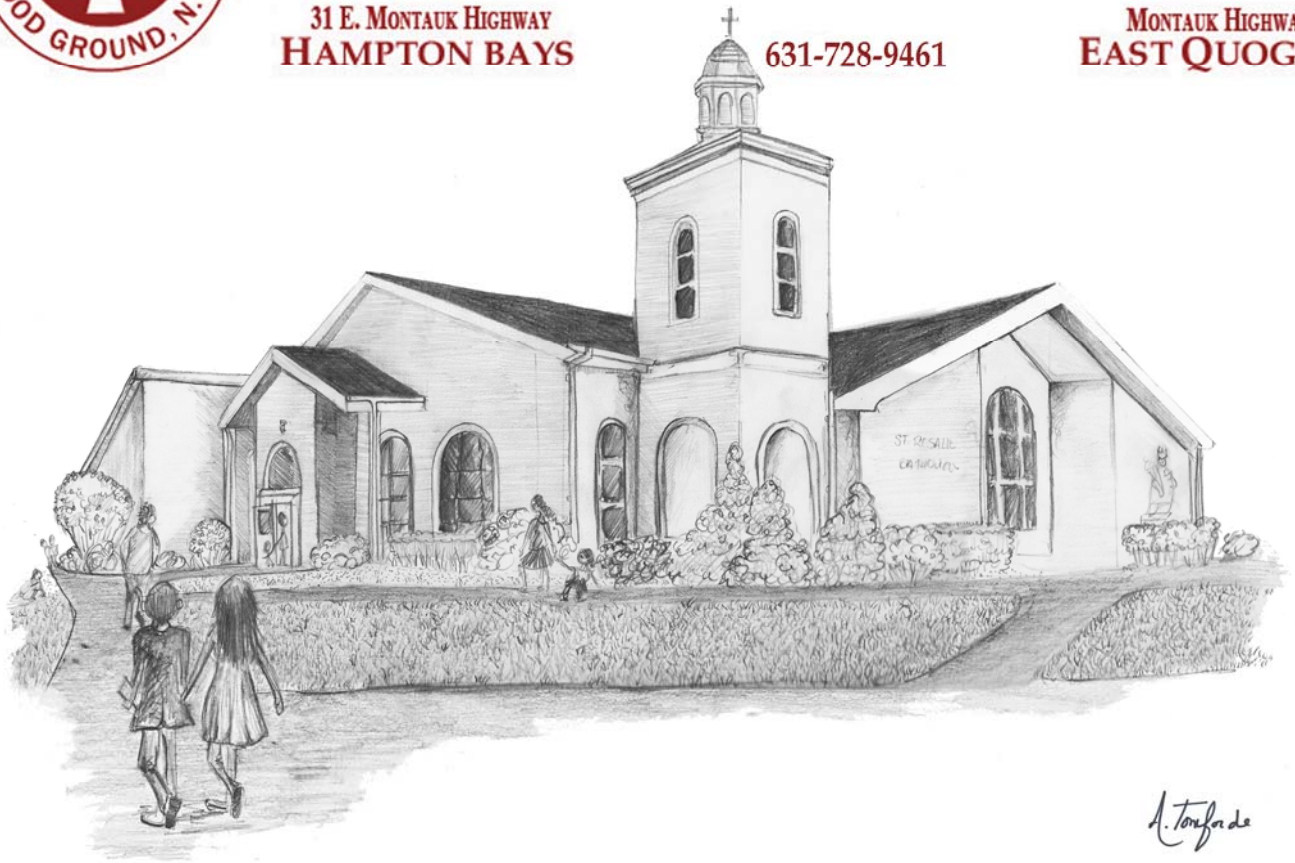

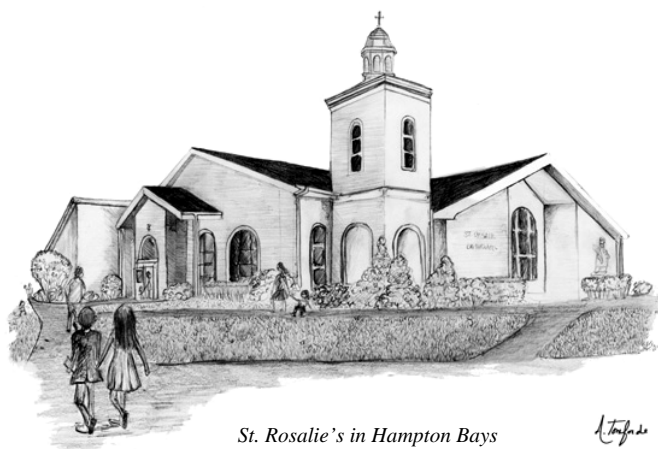

### SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

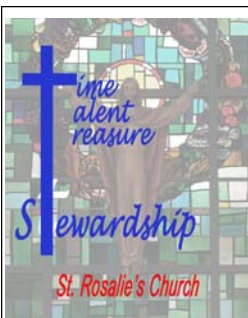
Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4–4:30 p.m. or by appointment.

## From The Pastor's Desk

### The Transfiguration of the Lord

In today's gospel we hear that *Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and led them up a high mountain where he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun; his clothes became white as light.* MATTHEW 17:1-2 Peter is very moved by the appearance of Elijah and Moses. A voice is heard: *"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."* MATTHEW 17:5

Peter asks our Lord if he can build three tents. Peter wants to remain on that mountain, in the religious experience he is having. Evidently he feels peace and tranquility, perhaps an inkling of what heaven must be like. Jesus reminds Peter and the disciples that there are more than just these experiences – that, Jesus Himself as well as us will need to suffer as followers of Jesus Christ.

Do we allow ourselves to lose our focus, when the going gets rough? Sometimes things will be great, everything seems to go our way, but then times get difficult; someone gets ill, or relationships are broken – in need of healing. Think, that although following Christ has its mountains, such as we hear today in the "transfiguration," there are also going to be valleys. Yes, the mountains help us to get through the valleys. Christ suffered and died for us.

Our Lenten practices call us into a discipline of Lent, calling us to live in a new way with Jesus. Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving give us the armor to defeat evil that attracts us to the easy way out – not just wanting to stay on the mountain-top, but willing as the song says "to march into hell for a heavenly cause" (*The Impossible Dream*). Let us choose to follow Jesus Christ who calls us to resist temptation and to follow Him. The mountains help you get through the valleys. Most importantly follow the words of God, Our Father in heaven regarding Jesus Christ, His Only Son: "LISTEN TO HIM."

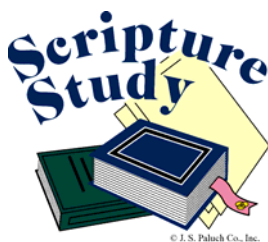

## LENTEN MISSION

### *Anger, Forgiveness and Healing*

### March 19, 20, 21 at 7 p.m.

**Dr. Margaret A. Schlientz**, has Masters degrees in Theology (Marquette University), Spirituality (Creighton University), Psychiatric Nursing (University of Maryland) and a Doctorate in Psychiatric Nursing (University of Pittsburgh).

In her professional career as a university administrator and teacher (Marquette University), she has developed the integration of the psychological and spiritual relationship necessary for human growth and development.

With her professional expertise, she works as a national consultant as an agent of change affecting the internal culture within the health care system. Because of the value integration for human growth, she has consulted with numerous religious communities and dioceses.

In addition to her work with health care systems she is the Assistant Director at the Institute for Priestly Formation at Creighton University where she teaches and ministers to diocesan seminarians in an intensive ten week spiritual renewal program each summer.

Also, she is part of the team with the Institute training diocesan priests in a three year program in spiritual direction integrating the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola.

Committed to the ministry of healing she has taught numerous workshops throughout the world aiding clergy and laity in the ministry of healing and deliverance. She previously chaired the Conference on Deliverance and Exorcism annually held in August each year beginning in 2005 at Mundelein Seminary, Mundelein IL.

The Pope Leo XIII Institute was founded by Margaret for the education of priests in exorcism and deliverance. She was executive director from 2012 until 2015.

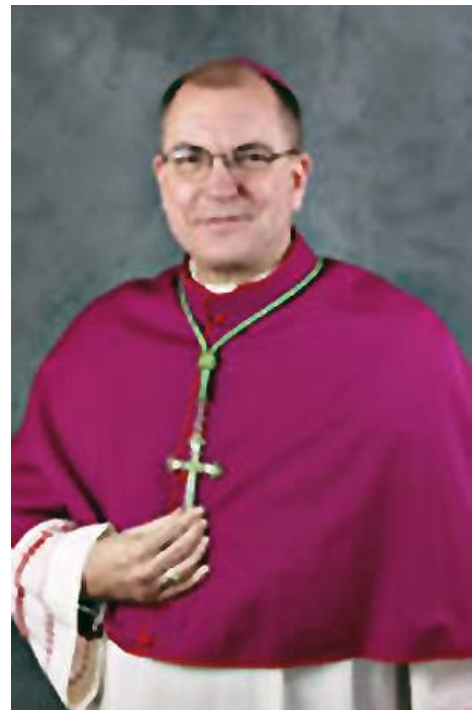
